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Program Goal

- This unique lunchtime program will equip participants with essential skills and frameworks for developing strategic thinking, creativity, innovation and leadership communication.
- Graduates will gain the skills to recognize the most pressing environmental disruptors facing organizations and respond with innovative strategies.

Program Uniqueness & Structure



- This MS program consists of ten 8-week courses (30 credits)
 - Each course will meet once in a week
 - Five times over Zoom and three times in-person in TechTown Detroit with lunch: (11:30am 1:30pm)
 - We will offer two courses per session (8-week session)
- Uniqueness also comes from its focus on application-based learning
 - The program will offer extensive opportunity for networking with fellow professionals and experienced managers with expertise in their fields.
 - All courses offer case and project/simulation-based learning.
 - Active participation of senior managers in many of these courses taught by expert faculty.

Minimum Eligibility for Admission



- Earned a four-year baccalaureate degree from a regionally accredited U.S. institution or an equivalent degree from a non-U.S. institution in any discipline
- A minimum cumulative undergraduate grade point average of 2.7 on a 4.0 scale, or 3.0 in the last half of the undergraduate program
- Students must be currently employed at a professional level
 - Must submit a resume with names and contact information for two references
 - A letter from a supervisor regarding their employment as a professional. The applicant will upload this letter to their application (An email confirmation that you are working can also be uploaded in place of a formal letter). You can submit your application while you are waiting for the letter of your job confirmation.

Program Fees



- Total Fees = \$26,000 for the entire program (\$2,600 per course)
- For fall enrollees we are offering \$1,000 scholarship for the entire program
- Course material will be offered without any additional cost
- Lunch for all the in-person meetings will be offered without any additional cost
- You will pay fees on a session-by-session basis.

Fall 24 program intake will be capped somewhere between 20 and 25 students.



More About Schedule & Program Completion



- Fall 2024 starts on August 20
 - No classes on the Week starting on November 25, 2024
 - Winter break December 13, 2024 through January 8, 2025
 - First 5 sessions will be completed on June 19, 2025
 - Summer break June 20, 2025 August 25, 2025
- It's possible to complete the program in only five sessions (8-week session)
- If you take a combination of one and two courses in different sessions, you could complete this
 program in different time periods
- For instance, if you take one courses in session 1, one course in session 2, two courses in sessions 3 through 5, you will be able to complete the program in December instead of June
- For extraordinary situations we may be able to work with individual students to complete their programs in a timely manner
