Your Pathway to Success

Eastern Michigan University has partnered with your school district to offer students interested in becoming teachers a path to a teaching career. This program aims to support students academically and personally throughout their entire college career, from admission to graduation. The successful EMU graduate will then have the opportunity to interview for any appropriate open positions in their home district.

At EMU students can choose the kind of teacher they want to be.

- Teach children from pre-school through elementary grades
- Work with middle and high school students in secondary education
- Specialize in arts, sciences, math, languages or technology education for K-12
- Work with physically, emotionally or intellectually challenged children

Student Requirements

Upon admission to EMU students are required to:

- Enroll in at least 12 credit hours each fall and winter semester
- Maintain an overall GPA of 2.5
- Meet with their designated counselor each semester

The Application Process

- Any potential students you've identified should apply online for expedited admission to EMU at emich.edu/selectscholars.
- This link will waive the \$35 application fee.
- Typical admission decisions will be made within 7 business days from submission of a completed application.

Scholarship Opportunities

Applicants will be automatically considered for one of two EMU scholarships.

- Emerald Scholarship: Annual award of \$3,000–\$6,500 awarded based on high school GPA and test scores.
- Education First Opportunity Scholarship (EFOS): Pell eligible students with a minimum 3.0 high school GPA and 1029 SAT score will be given an award to cover the remainder of full tuition costs after federal pell grant has been applied.
