

THE EMU CHOIR



The Eastern Michigan University Choir is a highly select auditioned ensemble comprising students from across the university, most of whom are music majors whose principal area is voice study. They maintain a rigorous rehearsal and performance schedule and focus predominantly on choral art music for advanced chamber choir.

With its tradition spanning back to 1854, singing at EMU has a long tradition of musical excellence. Under the direction of Dr. Johnson recent invitations have included two European Concert Tours, two performances with Grammy-nominated tenor Andrea Bocelli, 2018 Carnegie

Hall Performance, 2018 Central/North Central American Choral Directors Association Conference, 2018 Michigan Music Conference, 2017 Michigan ACDA State Conference, finalist in the American Prize & the release of four recordings in the past six artistic seasons. The members of the EMU Choir have been thrilled with these opportunities and gratefully acknowledge their former members, whose commitment to artistry helped develop this musical tradition.

THE CONDUCTOR

Brandon Johnson, DMA is the Director of Choral Activities at Eastern Michigan University. He has conducted professional musicians across the United States while maintaining his extensive work with students of all ages. He has performed in venues across the country including Lincoln Center's Alice Tully Hall, the Kennedy Center and the renowned Carnegie Hall.

Choirs under his direction have been invited to perform for state and regional American Choral Directors Association (ACDA) and the National Association for Music Education (NAFME) conferences. As a conducting pedagogue, his students have been invited to participate in the ACDA National Conducting Competition.

He has studied with German conductor Helmuth Rilling and was selected to conduct the Grammy-winning Oregon Bach Festival Chorus and
