On August 31, 2018, Dr. Glenn K. Walker retired from EMU after 42 years of outstanding dedication to the students of EMU. His ability to keep his students enthralled by his lectures is legendary in the Biology Department and extends to the other departments that his courses have served, especially Aging Studies. This can be seen in the outstanding evaluations he consistently received over his long career. He mentored dozens of undergraduate and graduate students, a high proportion of whom went on to have successful careers as Ph.D.'s, M.D.'s and D.O.'s. His enthusiasm is infectious and has motivated untold students to carry their projects to successful completion. Many are still in touch with him and they continue to sing his praises. Dr. Walker has always gone above and beyond all expectation to help his colleagues in their personal and professional lives.
